Hi'iakaikapoliopele: Visual Stories by Contemporary Native Hawaiian Artists September 12 – October 24, 2009

This invitational exhibition will include accomplished upcoming artists of Hawaiian ancestry who have been asked to create work with inspiration from the epic tale *Hi'iakaikapoliopele, Ka Mo'olelo O Hi'iakaikapoliopele*, by Ho'oulu-mahiehe. The artists' work will include sources of inspiration from traditional hula, chants, characters and places of the goddess Pele and her younger sister, Hi'iaka. This exhibition will be traveling to the Hawai'i State Art Museum in Honolulu.



Roots of Inspiration: Contemporary Functional Furniture November 8 – December 23, 2009

A select group of Hawai'i's furniture makers will each create one unique piece of functional furniture based on an inspirational source from artifacts, antiques or architecture of pre- or post-contact Hawai'i. Expect to see exceptional craftsmanship and technical excellence in carving, turning and inlay with materials such as koa, milo, kamani and Norfolk pine.

The Essence of Maui January 9 – February 20, 2010

If you had to name one thing that defines the essence of Maui, what would it be? We invited a group of artists from the Maui community to determine what the physical, spiritual, cultural or social essence of Maui is to them and to create one unique piece to show their touchstone. This promises to be an intriguing exhibit with visual depth, personal meaning, and shared interest.

Gaylen Hansen: Three Decades of Paintings May 8 – June 19, 2010

Organized by the Museum of Art at Washington State University, this exhibit brings together a retrospective of 30 years of this remarkable artist's development. It traces the evolution of Hansen's narrative paintings which encompass the landscape of the rural West. Colorful large-scale compositions of horses, dogs, fish, grasshoppers, and Hansen's alter ego "the Kernal" lead viewers into his playful world of humor and humanity.
